

Music Note Resin Cufflinks

Feel like Beethoven himself with these fabulous music note resin cufflinks! And a one, and a two, and a one, two, three, four...



Before you begin: Choose and print your images, but please be sure to observe copyright laws!

Step 1

Choosing the perfect picture

Select a 16mm diameter area that will work well in your cufflink blanks and cut out with scissors.

Step 2

Sealing the image

Using a piece of scrap paper or card, 'seal' the images by spraying with hairspray on both sides. Leave to dry.

Tip: coating with PVA glue will also work!



What you'll need:

Beginner's Resin Kit	860 031B
Round Rhodium Plated	
Cufflink Blanks	N2U 111R
Devcon Epoxy Glue	999 CJ2
On Balance DE-600 Scales	997 1501
Arretil Skin protection Cream	860 032A
Scissors	
Hairspray	
Printed images	
Scrap paper or card	
Scrup paper or cara	



Step 4

Applying the image

Use a thin layer of Devcon epoxy glue to stick your images inside your cufflink blanks. Leave to dry



Step 5

Making a flat surface

Using one mixing cup and two mixing sticks from your resin kit, create a stand for your cufflink blanks to keep them flat during the resin process.



Step 6

Protecting your digits

Apply the skin protection cream or plastic gloves to protect your hands.

Step 7

Weighing

Using the scales, weigh your resin into a mixing pot at a ratio of two parts resin to one-part hardener.

1 gram of resin and 0.5 grams of hardener will be plenty for this project.

Note: this must be measured by weight, not volume!



Step 8

Stirring

Stir the mixture thoroughly using the remaining mixing stick from your resin kit – be careful not to stir too quickly - to minimise air bubbles in the resin.



Step 9

Filling in the blanks

Use the mixing stick to pour a few drops of resin into each cufflink blank. If necessary, use the mixing stick to carefully push the resin up to the edges of the blank.

Continue adding drops of resin until a slight dome forms, then leave to cure overnight.
